WHITEHALL CEMENT PLANT

The Whitehall cement plant is located in Pennsylvania and was constructed in 1899, making it one of the oldest operating cement plants in the US.

- 80 employees
- Safety-first culture, the importance of safe behaviors and a safety mindset is constantly emphasized as the highest priority, with the goal of zero harm to people
- Produces 14 different types of cement
- Community-focused approach, supporting local organizations and events, including partnering with the Wildlands Conservancy and local Boy Scouts of America

The Whitehall facility utilizes tires as part of the plant Alternative Fuels program. It also operates a Selective Catalytic Reducer (SCR) to help control emissions. Other environmental sustainability initiatives include:

- Producing TerCem, one of the lowest carbon-footprint cements of the EcoPlanet line of environmentally friendly cements
- Reducing CO₂ emissions by 35% since 1990
- Replacing traditional non-renewable fuels like coal and petroleum coke by 50%
- Partnering with the Wildlands Conservancy, a local non-governmental organization dedicated to conservation and environmental education in Pennsylvania.
- Consuming 2 million tires per year, which diverts those tires away from Pennsylvania landfills, while providing the plant with 30% of its fuel
